TLVC's Tree Planting Partnership with the Chesapeake Bay Foundation



On April 27th and 28th, TLVC participated in the 10 Million Tree Partnership with CBF. Together with 80 volunteers, the conservancy planted 400 trees on 7 preserved properties across Lebanon County. Working with landowners, volunteers planted sycamore, maple, river birch, dogwood and winterberry along riparian buffers on these properties. The trees will help to protect the valuable waterways in Lebanon County and downstream. The initiative was funded by CBF



and the conservancy recruited community volunteers, student groups, business leaders and Board members who volunteered their time to help. Thank you to the landowners and volunteers for your support in this great project. We hope to continue to help CBF plant 10 million trees by 2025.
